## *20 Is Plenty on Our Neighborhood Streets*

Have you glanced at your speedometer when you are in the middle of a block? You will probably find it is pretty easy to reach or top 25 mph, the standard residential speed limit. To someone on foot navigating streets with parked cars and unprotected intersections, it feels like you are driving too fast. With a small change of dropping your speed to 20 mph, it becomes much easier to halt the momentum of 3000 pounds of metal. You will get more smiles from your neighbors instead of dirty looks.

Research from the US has shown that kids under 14 are far more likely to be hit by cars on streets with speed limits up to 25 miles per hour, presumably because that is where they are usually playing. Other studies have shown that the odds of a pedestrian dying after being hit by a car traveling 20 miles per hour is about 5 percent, and they get worse in a hurry the faster the car is traveling. At 30 mph it is a 45 percent death rate, which multiplies the danger to pedestrians by nine fold. At 20 mph it takes 46 feet to come to a stop and at 30 mph it takes 87 feet to stop.

Slowing down makes our neighborhood much safer for children, pedestrians, bicyclists and pets. It will also curb the noise in the neighborhood. So make sure you glance down at your speedometer and remember 20 is plenty!
