The deadline for sponsorships is June 30. This is our biggest fundraiser for our neighborhood and we could not do it without sponsors and our neighbors doing their part!



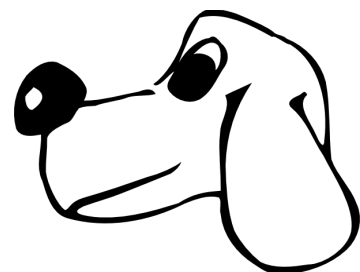

Neighborhood Traffic Safety

If you have a traffic complaint about an occurring situation that poses an immediate threat (emergency situation), please call 911 for a police response.

Traffic complaints regarding ongoing issues such as chronic speeding, running stop signs or other traffic hazards in neighborhoods can be emailed to OCPD. Your complaint will be reviewed by a police supervisor for assignment to an officer.

To register a traffic complaint to the Oklahoma City Police Department, email your detailed message to ocpd.trafficcomplaints@okc.gov, including the specific location and specific examples or call the police non-Emergency line at (405)231-2121.

OKC Launches Redesigned Website and Mobile App

With a redesigned website and new mobile app, it's easier than ever to access City of Oklahoma City services, news and information from your smartphone, tablet or computer.

The new okc.gov website and OKC Connect smartphone app are now live. Check out okc.gov on any device, and download the free app for your Apple or Android smartphone or tablet. You can also search for OKC Connect in your device's app store.

"Our new mobile-friendly website makes it easy to find the City information you are looking for in more than 75 languages," said Public Information and Marketing Director Kristy Yager. "The most popular services such as paying your water bill, looking for pet adoptions, reporting code violations and paying a ticket are prominently featured on the front page of the new website."

The features and design of the new, resident-focused okc.gov will make the website easier to navigate for users on all platforms, helping connect our community with City of OKC services. On the back end, it makes it easier for City staff to maintain and update the site, keeping information fresh, useful and current.

The OKC Connect app lets residents submit service requests through their smartphone, get information about City services and stay connected with updates. The expanded menu choices for Action Center service requests are integrated with the same system residents can use with a web browser on a computer. It's the same system Action Center and other City staff use, allowing staff to provide real-time updates on any platform the resident uses.

Recycle Mercury Thermostats

Mercury is a heavy metal that represents a threat to human health and the environment when released into the environment. An average wall thermostat contains 4 grams of mercury, the equivalent of 800 compact fluorescent lights. Preventing toxics like mercury from entering the waste stream plays a critical role in protecting our environment and water supply.

Oklahoma City's Public Works Stormwater Quality division operates the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility at 1621 S. Portland where mercury thermostats can be dropped-off for recycling during business hours. The facility is open Tuesday through Friday 9:30 a.m. — 6 p.m., and on Saturday 8:30 — 11:30 a.m. The center is free to Oklahoma City residents, but you must bring your City water bill as proof of residency.

For additional convenience, the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality has partnered with Covanta Tulsa and Locke Supply to provide another way to responsibly recycle mercury thermostats. Contractors and homeowners can deliver the out-of-use mercury thermostats to any Locke Supply location across the state for recycling.
